**WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981  
APPLICATION FOR A PROPOSED DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER –  
OWERMOIGNE / CHALDON HERRING AND WINFRITH NEWBURGH**

The application to modify the definitive map and statement of rights of way by upgrading Bridleway 10 (part), Owermoigne, Bridleway 3, Chaldon Herring and Bridleways 22 and 21 (part), Winfrith Newburgh has now been considered by the Roads and Rights of Way Committee.

Their decision was that the application should be refused but an order be made to modify the definitive map and statement of rights of way to record Bridleway 10 (part) Owermoigne, Bridleway 3, Chaldon Herring and Bridleways 22 and 21 (part), Winfrith Newburgh as shown A – B – C – D – E – F – G – H – I – J – K – L – M - N on Drawing 11/10/1 as a restricted byway.


It is not yet known whether the applicant will exercise his right of appeal to the Secretary of State. No further action will be taken by the County Council unless we are directed to make an order.

The Chief Executive will publish an Order reflecting this decision in due course and a Notice will be erected on site and appear in the press. You will be sent copies of the Order and Notice. The Notice will give you details of how you can, if you wish, make a representation or object to the Order. If there are no objections within the prescribed period the Order can be confirmed. However, if there are objections the matter will be referred to the Secretary of State for determination, either by written representations, public hearing or public inquiry.

P.T.O

For a modification order, the tests are solely about whether the evidence does or does not justify the change to the definitive map contained in the order. The Secretary of State has the power to disregard irrelevant objections.
